CHALLENGE WEEK

What's it all about?

What? No classes? As most of you will know, Challenge Week is where we collapse the timetable for the last week of term in the summer and all students choose a week-long 'Challenge' to take part in. This year there are 9 options to choose from; all Challenges are open to all year groups. Some involve residential stays and others are based around day trips from home. Each Challenge has activities spread over four days (Monday to Thursday) and we all come back together in school on the Friday for a whole-school assembly and presentations, before breaking up for the summer at 1.30pm on 22nd July.

A 'normal' Challenge Week: We are getting back to something akin to a 'normal' Challenge Week, having had to cancel in 2020 and run a limited programme in 2021. Many of you have therefore not experienced a 'full-on' Challenge Week! We have put together a programme with a mix of Challenges to cater for a range of tastes and interests.

Water Sports & Activities Maximum 30 students

On Wednesday, we travel to Osmington Bay in Weymouth for a two night stay at a PGL activity centre. They'll feed us, lead us in activities throughout the day, and entertain us in the evening! 

Learn to climb and parkour in the safety of dedicated centres in Poole, then tackle an outdoor climb and coasteering with our partners at Cumulus Outdoors. Test your physical and mental strength and stamina! You will be encouraged to push the boundaries of your comfort zone and to overcome any fears in a fun, supportive environment. Help others climb further than they've climbed before. Suitable for complete beginners or those with some experience.

What is coasteering? It's a sea and cliff based adventure activity, which allows you to explore the coast under the supervision of qualified and experienced instructors. It involves rock scrambling, low level climbing, sea swimming and cliff jumping - only from a level you are comfortable with!



For parents / carers

Sign-up Process

- Consider the Challenge Week alternatives carefully with your son/daughter. They might also like to discuss with their friends. DECIDE ON A FIRST, SECOND AND THIRD PREFERENCE. Some Challenges are residential, some are non-residential and the cost of each differs as per the information in this booklet. Discounts are available for families who qualify for Free School Meals, and the reduced prices are indicated in the trip details.
- There are limits on the number of students who can participate in each Challenge (due to factors relating to transport, accommodation and activity capacity). Whilst we hope most students will be able to participate in their first preference, we unfortunately can't guarantee this and our sign-up process is intended to be as fair as we can make it.
- To ensure all students have the same opportunity to discuss the options with family and friends, we will open sign-ups in the week after the Easter Holidays as below. Preferences cannot be submitted before.
- The 'opening date/time' for sign-ups will be 7PM on WEDNESDAY 27th APRIL 2022. The sign-up process will be a very simple online form that can be completed on PC or smartphone. The form will be live on the school's website at 7pm on the 27th and we will also text a link to the form at the same time. - Sign-up to trips will be allocated on a first come, first served basis (allowing for any restrictions created by single-sex sharing on residential trips).
- Once a place is allocated, the school will assign your son/daughter to that specific Challenge on your ParentPay account this will be done by close of play on Friday 29th April 2022 so that you can pay the deposit.
- Deposits must be paid via ParentPay by midnight on Tuesday 3rd May 2022. Your son/daughter's place on their Challenge is not secure until the deposit has been paid.
- The balances for all Challenge Week activities are to be paid (again via ParentPay) by no later than 30th June 2022. The balance can be paid in full or in fortnightly instalments.

Once you have been signed up to a particular Challenge you cannot change your mind. If you are experiencing particular financial difficulty, or have genuine difficulty completing an online form, please speak to Miss Taylor before sign-up goes live.
