## CHALLENGE WEEK

### What's it all about?

As most of you will know, during the last week of the Summer Term we dispense with the timetable so that all students can benefit from a week of trips and experiences. During Challenge Week, we offer a range of options, some involving residential stays and others based from home, across a range of interests and at various price points.

Each Challenge has activities spread over four days (Monday to Thursday) and we come back together in school on the Friday for a whole-school assembly and presentations, before breaking up for summer at 1.30pm on 19th July 2024.







### How to choose:

Trips are open to all year groups and your choice will probably boil down to the best fit between your interests, new things you'd like to experience, things you know you'll enjoy and cost. Discuss the options with your family and chat to your friends. Whilst you might prefer to be together with your friends, please remember that if your friends aren't keen on the same Challenge as you or you don't all get your first choice, you can still have a great time when you are busy with activities and getting to know other people. Rather than choosing something you're already familiar with, why not opt for something slightly out of your comfort zone and challenge yourself to learn or experience something new?

## The Swanage Surfers

### Maximum 30 students, led by Mr Butler

Our popular surf camp Challenge is back again. Learn to surf or add to any existing experience you have on a fun THREE-NIGHT RESIDENTIAL in Pembrokeshire, Wales. This year, our accommodation will be the St Davids Bunk Barns, with stunning sea views, direct access to the Coast Path and within easy walking distance of the beach and the centre of St Davids. Surf tuition and other activities will be provided by The Real Adventure Company. This year, we will also take on coasteering and coastal kayaking.



### Itinerary

## London: Film & Media

### Maximum 20 students, led by Mr Kirkham

A TWO-NIGHT RESIDENTIAL trip to London, exploring with a film-makers eye. The trip includes a visit to see the musical theatre version of 'Back to the Future', as well as seeing 'Apollo I I: First Steps Edition' at the IMAX cinema (the UK's biggest screen!) and a movie at a West End cinema. We'll also visit London Zoo for a spot of filming.

### Itinerary

Mon We meet at Wareham Station from where we take the train to London Waterloo and on by tube to Earls Court to check-in to our Youth Hostel (YHA). We'll have time for a bit of exploring before an early dinner and heading to The Adelphi Theatre to see 'Back to the Future: The Musical'.

Tue After breakfast at the YHA, we take the tube to Waterloo for a short film at the BFI IMAX cinema. We'll take an open-top bus tour or a river cruise before dinner and a movie in London's famous Leicester Square or a nearby cinema.

Wed We check out of the Youth Hostel and take the tube to Baker Street. From here, it's a 20 minute walk to London Zoo where we will do a spot of filming before heading home by train to Wareham, arriving late afternoon/early evening.

Thur Back at school, we will compile and edit footage captured in London and enjoy fish & chips for lunch.

## Sailing & Watersports

### Maximum 30 students, led by Miss Brook

Back for a second year, our Sailing & Watersports Challenge will enable you to learn sailing from scratch and achieve Level 1 or, if you did this Challenge last year, to gain Level 2 (RYA Sailing Course) culminating with a sail over to Hamworthy Park for an activity filled afternoon. There will also be a day of other water-based activities thrown in the mix, again all suitable for beginners - kayaking, paddleboarding, windsurfing and Mega-SUP.

### Itinerary

Each day we travel by minibus to Rockley Park for a 9.30am arrival. The day ends at 4pm, so we should be back in Swanage by 4.30-5pm.

Mon The start of our two day RYA sailing course.

Tue Our Sailing course continues.

Wed A break from sailing as we take part in a multi-activity day on the water. Activities include windsurfing, kayaking, Mega Sup and stand-up paddle boarding.

Thur Back to sailing, we sail in groups from Rockley Park to Hamworthy Park in Drascombes (hold up to 10), Wayfarers or Picos. We have our packed lunches at Hamworthy Park before taking part in some games. We sail back to Rockley for the usual 4pm finish.

A superb science-themed THREE NIGHT RESIDENTIAL trip to London, taking in two of London's famous museums, the Planetarium in Greenwich (including live show 'The Sky Tonight') and a visit to The Centre of the Cell, the first Science Education Centre in the world to be located within working biomedical laboratories. In addition, you will join the London Film group to see a musical theatre show - 'Back to the Future: The Musical' in the West End.

### Itinerary - days may change!

Mon We meet at Wareham for our train journey to London, and then continue by tube to Russell Square where we check into our hotel. During the afternoon we have time to explore before dinner and heading to the Adelphi Theatre to see 'Back to the Future: The Musical'.

## London: Performing Arts

A staple of our Challenge Week offer! This year it includes not just one, but two musical theatre shows and a tour of Shakespeare's Globe Theatre where a third show (a play) might prove possible. A visit to the London Dungeon is included so this trip is not for the faint-hearted as you may find this scary and all must participate. This Challenge is a TWO NIGHT RESIDENTIAL, staying at a Central London hotel. During the trip we will see 'Matilda the Musical' in London's West End and 'SIX' in Southampton! Listings for Shakespeare's Globe are not yet available, but if possible we will see a performance there, otherwise we will go to the cinema or find an alternative activity. Back in Swanage, it will be flashmob time!

### Itinerary

Mon Meet at Wareham station for the train to London Waterloo and then on by tube to Russell Square to check into our hotel. In the afternoon, we tour the historic Globe Theatre (and possibly see a play performed). We'll have dinner at Pizza Express.

Tue After breakfast at the hotel, we visit The London Dungeon. The afternoon will be spent exploring Covent Garden before dinner at The Hard Rock Cafe and our evening show 'Matilda The Musical'.

### IMPORTANT INFORMATION

### For parents/carers

Some Challenges are residential, some are non-residential and the cost of each differs as per the information in this booklet. We are conscious of financial pressures and have made sure there are options for a range of budgets and several that are £25 or less, all of which can be paid in instalments. Discounts are available for families who qualify for Free School Meals and the reduced prices are indicated in the trip details. If you are experiencing particular financial difficulty, please speak to Mrs Heath in confidence before sign-up goes live.

There are limits on the number of students who can participate in each Challenge (due to factors relating to transport, accommodation and activity capacity). Whilst we hope most students will be able to participate in their first preference, we unfortunately can't guarantee this and the sign-up process is intended to be as fair as we can make it.

To ensure all students have the same opportunity to discuss the options with family and friends, we will open sign-up as below. Preferences cannot be submitted before.

### Sign-up & payment process:

- Consider the Challenge Week alternatives carefully with your son/daughter. They might also like to discuss with their friends. **DECIDE ON A FIRST, SECOND AND THIRD PREFERENCE.**
- The 'opening date/time' for sign-ups will be **7PM on MONDAY 26TH FEBRUARY 2024.** The sign-up process will be a very simple online form that can be completed on PC or smartphone. The form will be live on the school's website at the time above and we will also text a link to the form at the same time. If you have genuine difficulty completing an online form, please let Mrs Heath (Office Manager) know before sign-up goes live. - Allocation of places will be on a first come, first serve basis (allowing for any restrictions created by single-sex sharing on residential trips). We check trip lists before confirming places and reserve the right to make changes where we feel they are justified. We will let you know if we have any concerns about the way the allocation has panned out that affects your child.
- **TRANSFER WINDOW!** New this year we are trialling a transfer window! Once lists are available, we will publish these in school for students to see. Should they wish to change their choice at this point, there will be a process to request this. Please note, allocating places based on transfer requests will not be an exact science, but rather a 'best fit' approach. Swaps or moves will only be possible where spaces are available, and this process should not be used simply to request a 'first choice' where a 'second choice' was allocated.
